Strategies and Tactics for the Company Officer Instructor: Anthony Avillio

This presentation is aimed at all officers and aspiring officers. Its objectives are based on what it takes to be an effective officer and an integral part of the organization. Discussed will be the use of command boards and how the accountability officer and incident commander can maintain a cooperative and effective approach to the critical priority of fire-ground safety. Company and battalion-level integrity and accountability will be a focus and discussion will include proper decentralization of the fire-ground to maximize information gathering, which allows for addressing strategies, accountability and safety. Personnel accountability reports will be discussed as will the duties of the safety officer and guidelines for rehab. In addition, structural fire analysis, risk management and the role of the officer will be covered. The officer's role in supervision will also be addressed to meet our highest priority: "Get 'em in safe, work 'em safe and get 'em out safe."
